

Grant" in the amount of \$17,000 was awarded to support the Joslin Diabetes Center in Syracuse. These funds will be used to create a new, expanded waiting area which will benefit a significant number of children in Upstate New York.

The pediatric waiting area at the Joslin Diabetes Center was only 180 square feet. The new, larger space will soon be 1260 square feet and allow the staff to see 8% more children in a more engaging environment. While at Joslin, children can enjoy the interactive wall modules, and state of the art iPads, game consoles and many other activities. This new fun activity center will provide a comfortable and less stressful area for a child waiting for their appointments.
