

Dr. Andy's Day for Kids- February 23, 2014 Noon-6 PM at Buffalo Brew Pub.

Doc's Day for Kids was started about 15 years ago by Dr Andrew Gage (mine and Tom Rusert 's brother in law, now deceased) and Keith Morgan, manager of the Buffalo Brew Pub. It was designed to help kids (Dr Andy has 6). Dr Andy got fellow Doctors to bar-tend at the Brew Pub the last Sunday afternoon in February. All tips and donations initially went to Children's Hospital. The Brew Pub donated all profits from food and drink sales from the event. All waitresses kicked in their tips. The first year they raised about \$500.

They have continued to grow the event adding individual and corporate sponsors. They switched the donation to Sisters Hospital because they committed to dedicate the funds to improve the Neo Natal Unit. The hospital foundation began to match funds up to a designated level. The hospital staff joined in to provide baskets for raffles. Doctors from the hospital and other areas joined in to help. The event had grown to now raise \$25,000 to \$30,000. The funds are used to purchase specialized state of the art equipment for newborns, which to my understanding helps prevent or treat potential blindness.

The GI Lions have been donating to this cause for the last several years.
