

As our Lions year comes to a close and a new one begins, everyone associated with the Brandel - Murphy Youth Foundation would like to take this moment to thank all of the "Everyday Heroes" who provide countless "Miracles Through Service" to children in need throughout Multiple District 20.

The year which began like any other finished like none before it. New York City became the global epicenter of the Covid-19 pandemic and even though the more rural areas of the state did not experience the same extreme health crisis, many people there still lost their jobs, schools closed, businesses were shut down, and children and families became desperate for food, shelter, and help of any kind.

Yet, through it all, we as Lions remained on the front lines, helping wherever we could. Even if our clubs could not physically meet we still joined in virtual networks of hope, planning ways in which we could help those in need.

That dedication is perfectly reflected in the following grants which were dispersed during the 2019-2020 year:

 \$58,000 matching Humanitarian Grants were awarded to 15 Lions Clubs that will help over 51,000 children through programs such as opiate awareness training, sports activities like baseball fields and swimming programs, community centers and so much more.

Even during the awful months of the statewide Covid-19 shutdown, the Foundation was still "open for business" approving nearly \$43,000 in additional Covid-19 related Emergency Grants including:



- Emergency Relief for Food provided to Districts W. Y. O. R1, K2, and S as well as the Massapequa, Bellmore, and Valley Stream Lions clubs.
- Local Business and Youth Food Support to the LaGrange Lions Club.
- Help for Families to the Queens Nepalese Lions Club.
- Relief STEM Project to District R2.
- Food Backpack Program to District E1.
- Virtual Camp for Children with Cancer to the LI Indo American Lions Club.

As your club, zone, or district plans for the coming Lions year, please remember that all of these grants could not happen without your support. With the additional emergency grants awarded in the past year and for the foreseeable future, the Brandel - Murphy Youth Foundation needs your help now more than ever.

Our many ongoing fund-raising opportunities include our annual Super Bowl Raffle, purchasing a beautiful BMYF shirt, honoring an "Everyday Hero" with an invitation to a very special fellowship, and so much more.
