

Recently, former Grand Island resident Jim Carroll was in town from San Juan Island, Washington, visiting his mother Noni. He brought hearing aids from his Lions Club in San Juan to be donated for re-use. Although his club collects used eyeglasses there isn't a hearing aid re-use collection program.

Grand Island Lions Club President Dick Crawford and Treasurer Tom Witkowski would like to remind community residents that the Lions have collection points at the Town Hall, Golden Age Center, Grand Island Optical, Elderwood, Dr. Fred Ruocco's practice, and the MOG (Medical Oriented Gym) for eyeglasses and hearing aids. The club also accepts durable medical goods such as, but not limited to, wheelchairs, walkers, canes and commodes.

Vision Screening Update

To date, 668 children, 6 months to second grade age, have been vision screened in our community at Kaegebein, Sidway, Huth Road Elementary, Kiddo's Korner, St. Timothy's, and Island Kids. Nearly 10.5% of the kids, 70 in all, have vision anomalies that require attention either through eyewear and/or medical intervention.

I will be contacting Care-A-Lot, St. Stephen's, and Trinity's St. Cooperative Nursery School to get them onboard with this free and very valuable project.

Our club board of directors has given approval to research GoFundMe (or other fundraising sites) to solicit funds under the auspices of our district first, then our club as Plan B. If you or your employer, circle of friends, family, whatever, would like to donate, we'd be all too happy to accept your and their generosity. The district's goal is to get three more screeners at a cost of \$7,000 each. It will apply for a \$10,500 matching International grant, which means we need to raise a like amount. We (as a district) are \$4300 shy of that goal. Donations can be made out to "District 20N Lions" ensuring "Vision Screener Designated Fund" is entered on the check's memo line. Donations can be sent to Cabinet Treasurer PDG Jim Luckman, 2761 Caledonia Street, Newfane, NY 14108.

In our Multiple, composed of 12 districts, over 35,000 kids have been screened with 5,000 being referred. Our district has screened 40% (nearly 14,000) of this number with an average referral rate of 12% not counting Buffalo, which stands at 20% being referred. These numbers underscore the value of early childhood screening. More good news: the International is collaborating with VSP (www.vsp.com) to provide eye exams and eyeglasses based upon income requirements. PDG Mike stated that with all this good news, we've become the victim of our own success. Simply, we need more screeners, whether they are Lions or not. This isn't a one-shot program. All our efforts need to be done annually, so any time you can give will be put to awesomely good use. In no time at all (really!), you will become expert at screening. So let me know and we can set up a workshop to get ya going!


