The Vision Beyond Sight Foundation, is requesting your attendance at two events on Saturday, October 19th. VBSF will be holding its' second biannual meeting between 10am and 11am with registration at 9:30am at the Olmsted Center for the Visually Impaired, located at 1170 Main Street in Buffalo. The meeting will consist of seeking delegates, alternates to the Foundation for determining how funds will be raised and allocated providing state-of-the-art equipment for the Lions Diagnostic Eye Center at the Ross Eye Institute in Buffalo, currently used by 231 Grand Island residents. The Lions of our district have provided over \$400,000 in equipment and technology to the LDEC. Dr. Lema is the REI's newest Retina Specialist and will present on Macular Degeneration and how imaging impacts the patient's care. The goal is to demonstrate the importance of the HRA/OCT which is the next technology we Lions will purchase. The HRA/OCT is an imaging device that looks much like the slit lamp we are familiar with when we have our eyes examined. The unique property of this technology is that can present in 3D, the structures of AND behind the retina...a truly amazing piece of cutting edge technology!



After the meeting, we will need Lions to stuff nearly 17,000 envelopes for the Foundation's first fundraiser via mailing. The more Lions and volunteers on hand, the faster the process. Refreshments will be served. So if you can't make it to the meeting, please attend the stuffing party beginning at 11am at the Olmsted Center. Park in the back of the building.
