Grand Island Lions 55th Annual Special Kids Picnic

On July 17,2013 at the Buffalo Launch Club Grounds over 800 children and staff were treated to boat rides. pony rides, Shriner Mini Kar rides, face painting, popcorn, soda, hot dogs and hamburgers. The Niagara Experience Players, a group of young people from Niagara Falls and North Tonawanda entertained the children with singing and dancing. Sabretooth, Pringles the Clown, Danny the Magician, and Ms. Lion added to the festivities. Over 100 volunteers worked to make the day a special summer experience for kids with special needs. Groups volunteering included the Grand Island, Ransomville, Kenmore, and Merritton Ontario, Lions Clubs; the Excalibur boat, Knights of Columbus, Grand Island High School cheerleaders, Grand Island High School football team, as well as, Rotary Club members, Boy Scout Troop 104 and individual community people. Participating schools were Erie 1 BOCES from Williamsville, Clarence and West Seneca West school sites, Autistic Services, Heritage Education Centers, Sweet Home Schools, and People Inc. and Baker Victory Services.



Want to witness a Miracle???

Then come on out to Miracle League Field on Grand Island for "Lions Night" on the evening of Saturday, September 14, 2013. Witness the miracle of happiness on the faces of kids and young adults with disabilities who at one time could only play baseball in their dreams. Arrive by 7 p.m. and have a dog or a 'burg at the concession stand adjacent to the field. Miracle League Field is located in Veterans' Park behind the Grand Island Memorial Library at 1715 Bedell Road. The game gets underway at 7:30 p.m. and will be under the lights donated by R. B. U-Ren Equipment of Niagara Falls. The event is free and open to the public. Restrooms are available. The entire facility is handicapped accessible.

Miracle League Field is one of 250 fields located throughout the USA, Canada, Puerto Rico, and now in Australia. Over 200,000 children and young adults now participate in America's favorite pastime. It is played on a specialized rubber mat free of any obstacles making it a safe environment for everyone on the field. What makes this particular field unique is the time between the start of fundraising and opening day – just 11 months! The Lions Club International Foundation played a major role in getting the quarter-million dollar field built through a \$75,000 grant obtained by the Grand Island Lions club along with another \$22,000 the club raised at a fundraising dinner and also selling split club tickets at the World Junior League Hockey Tournament when it was hosted in Buffalo. It is an ongoing community-wide project with the hope of opening an adjacent handicapped accessible playground in the Fall of this year.

So be part of a miracle – whether it be as a player buddy to help them swing for the stars or your standard bench warmer cheering the players on. Come out and see what community involvement can do that has changed the lives of so many children and young adults. Batter up!
