

Lion Jerry's Pie served at the Lions Picnic

Strawberry Peanut Butter Pie

Serves: 10

Chilling Time: 2 hours

Ingredients:

1 ½cups crushed pretzels ½cup granulated sugar

½cup butter, melted

1cup creamy peanut butter

18-ounce package cream cheese

½cup powdered sugar

1 ½ cups frozen whipped dessert topping, thawed

121-ounce can LUCKY LEAF® Premium Strawberry Fruit

Filling & Topping

Directions:

Combine the crushed pretzels and granulated sugar, then stir in the melted butter.

Press the crumb mixture onto the bottom and sides of a 10-inch pie plate. Cover and chill.
